PATH UPDATES

PATH Educational Curriculum — We are pleased to announce the launch of the PATH 4-part course Accurate Hormone Testing designed to educate fellows and endocrinologists on the importance of, and methods to ensure, accurate hormone testing. This course focuses on different aspects of accurately testing and reading hormone assays. Each module will include a didactic lecture, examples, and case-based questions to test your knowledge. Module 1, The Importance of Hormone Measurements and Assay Standardization, with Alvin M. Matsumoto, MD focuses on focuses on the importance of hormone measurements and assay standardization and is eligible for 1.5 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits. This activity will be available as part of the Endocrine Society's Fellows Training Series, as well as the Society's public catalogue. **Register here!**

Module 2 is planned to release in March 2021 and will focus on hormone types and the characteristics of an ideal hormone assay. Module 3 is planned to release in July 2021 and will focus on methods used to measure hormones and validity and judging the quality of hormone assays. Module 4 is planned to release in November 2021 and will focus on factors affecting interpretation of hormone concentrations, specifically for use in diagnosing endocrine disorders. We encourage PATH members to help promote it to their organizations and colleagues.

PATH Initiative with Payors - PATH co-chairs Drs. Alvin Matsumoto and Hubert Vesper, along with CDC, NACDD, and ES project staff, have continued to collaborate with Avalon Healthcare Solutions, our newest PATH member. In December, Avalon's Clinical Advisory Board approved adding a note within two of the organization's policy statements strongly recommending the use of standardized assays for testosterone testing. Plans are underway for providing education to Avalon's network of laboratories and providers regarding standardized testing for testosterone. A protocol to study the impact of the policy language and accompanying educational outreach is close to being finalized.

UPDATES FROM STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBERS

AACC -

- Pediatric Reference Intervals The effort to improve pediatric reference intervals (PRIs) one of AACC's top priorities has grown considerably throughout 2020. With the support of a number of new groups, AACC and its partners are poised to bring greater visibility to this important issue and will be well positioned to secure funding for the initiative in 2021. AACC's work with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to create an implementation plan has steadily progressed, ensuring the agency can quickly commence efforts to improve PRIs once money has been appropriated.
- Harmonization AACC continues to advocate for <u>harmonizing clinical laboratory test</u> <u>results</u>. The association, with the support of its partners, has succeeded in obtaining \$2 million for CDC to advance this effort each year since 2018. The House of Representatives has retained this amount in its fiscal year 2021 budget package. AACC is continuing to work with its allies in Congress to secure additional money in the next budget package.
